Headwaters Kids

Awana will look a little different this Fall

Awana stands for "Approved Workmen Are Not Ashamed" (2 Timothy 2:15).

The Awana curriculum centers on Scripture memorization and offers families the opportunity to have spiritual conversations at home as they assist their child in working through the material.

This Fall Awana will be done entirely at home, with verse time happening during HomeGroups.

If your family is not participating in HomeGroups but would like to do Awana, verses may be heard Sunday mornings (or, for special circumstances, online).

Patches and Jewels will be awarded for progress throughout the semester in a manner TBD. Lessons will be available on YouTube weekly to watch at your convenience.

Other changes this year include a switch from Lil' Lights (ages 2-3) to the similar Awana club, Puggles.

Total cost is \$15 per child, which covers the price of the book (\$10) as well as a supply fee (\$5) for awards.

What is a HomeGroup?

Headwaters HomeGroups are small groups that meet together every other week, for an hour and a half, at a regular time that works for everyone within the group, with the purpose of encouraging and building each other up in faith (I Thes. 5:8-11)

What do we do with the kids?

Each group will decide what works best for the group. If kids are old enough to play without interruption in another part of the home, that is great. Older siblings could watch younger kids, if kids are old enough they could be left at home, or the group could collectively hire a babysitter. Whatever works best for the group. Each group will be given a small budget that can be used to help offset these costs.

What does a regular HomeGroup night look like?

Generally, a night will be organized by the first thirty minutes being relational. Sharing dessert, talking through life developments, and just generally living life together. The next forty minutes will be a dialogue on the book, designated discussion questions, and any other

directed contented that the group leaders have been asked to include. The final twenty minutes is designated for taking requests and praying.

When do these groups begin and end?

The groups will begin in mid-September and end in mid-December.

What is the book about?

Relationships: A Mess Worth Making is a book by Paul Tripp and Timothy Lane that focuses on connecting the truth of who God is to how Christians should live together. It is an accessible book with short chapters that will provide a great foundation from which the group can build.

Is there a cost?

We are asking \$5/ book to help offset our cost. Other than that, each group may rotate on who brings food and the aforementioned option on babysitters but there are no other designated costs.

Do we have to meet in someone's home?

The intention is for groups to meet in homes because they tend to have a better relational

environment. Outdoors will also work when weather permits. If homes are not the best fit for the group the church buildings can be made available upon arrangement.

How big will the groups be?

Groups will be limited to 8-10 adults and capped at 10 kids.

How is AWANA incorporated?

During the first thirty minutes of fellowship time at least two adults will sit down with kids who are working through AWANA books and listen to their verses from the last two weeks. If more time is needed for verses it can be squeezed in at the end. This is the only official component of AWANA that will happen during HomeGroups.

How are the groups organized?

The congregation will sign up and be organized into groups based roughly on life stage.

Growth Groups

Growth Groups (GGs) are designed to help the women of Headwaters Church live out the calling of Philippians 1:27: "Only let your manner of life be worthy of the gospel of Christ...standing firm in one spirit, with one mind striving side by side for the faith of the gospel." GGs work toward this calling by gathering women monthly in small groups with the purpose of fellowship around the Word and encouragement to pursue wholehearted love and devotion to Jesus Christ. As sisters in Christ seek personal accountability and speak the truth in love to one another, the prayer is the "we will grow up in every way into...Christ." (Eph. 4:15)

How do Growth Groups work?

- GGs are intended for the women of Headwaters Church who are at least 18 years of age.
- GGs will consist of a total of 5 women or less. Each group will be led by a facilitator. GGs will include women representing various stages of life.
- GGs will meet one time a month (Sept-May) for 2 hours at a time determined by the GG members with the goal of ALL participants being at every meeting.

- GGs will meet in the home of the group facilitator or a participant. This year a Zoom group may also be offered for those not comfortable meeting in person. In an effort to provide a distraction-free and confidential environment, it is requested that children and guests not attend under any circumstance.
- GGs will use a book/resource as a guide for group discussions. All groups will use the same material selected by GG leadership.
- Women desiring to be a part of GGs must register/ submit the online application below. Once all applications have been received, they will be reviewed by GG leadership who will then form the groups.

What book will we be working through?

"Ten Questions to Diagnose Your Spiritual Health" by Donald S. Whitney

What can I expect?


- GGs are designed to encourage candid discussions centered on God's Word, Christ's sufficiency, and viewing all of life through the lens of Scripture.
- GGs are intended to foster transparency, authenticity, accountability, teachability, humility, growth in Christ-likeness, and a deeper love for Jesus: all in a safe and confidential environment.

What does my commitment involve?

- Participating in the assigned GG for the entire Sept-May cycle by attending all meetings.
- Coming to each meeting ready to participate by having all assigned material completed.
- Upholding an environment of confidentiality by keeping what is said in GGs within the group.
- Remembering to speak the truth in love in coming alongside one another and focus discussions on the truths of Scripture and how they can be applied to all aspects of life.





In Case You Didn't Know...

If you are at least 70 ½ years old and have made contributions to an IRA, you are eligible to make charitable contributions to a qualified charity directly from your IRA. Such contributions count toward annual Required Minimum Distributions (RMD) and are not included in Adjusted Gross Income as a Retirement Distribution.

A few rules:

- You can contribute more than your RMD as long as you do not exceed \$100,000 in a calendar year,
- You may not receive anything (other than an intangible religious benefit) from the charity as quid pro quo for your contribution,
- The charity must provide you an acknowledgment stating the amount of the charitable distribution and that no goods, services or benefits of any kind were or will be provided to you in consideration for the distribution from the IRA,
- The contribution cannot go to a donor-advised fund, supporting organization or private foundation,
- You cannot make the charitable IRA distribution from Simplified Employee Plans and Savings Incentive Match Plans for Employees if an employer contribution is made for that year.,
- You would not include any such contributions as itemized deductions because they are already excluded from Adjusted Gross Income.

Potential benefits:

If your financial situation allows you to donate IRA funds to a charity, you can benefit tax-wise if you match one of more the following profiles:

- You don't itemize deductions (under the normal rules only itemizers get any income tax benefit from charitable donations),
- You want to avoid being taxed on the required minimum distribution amount that you must take from your IRA,
- You want to reduce your Adjusted Gross Income on your tax return.

If this has piqued your interest, consider speaking to your financial planner, CPA or the financial institution that holds your IRA about arranging for a "Qualified Charitable Distribution" (QCD).
